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Paula Taylor is an Executive Officer at the Centre for Innovation and Learning, an ACT Education Directorate STEM Centre in Canberra. She has been an advocate of STEM and transformational change in schools for over 20 years in Canada and Australia. She currently works with teachers across the Australian Capital Territory to develop and teach lessons that provides students with complex problems and allows for open inquiry.

Dr Serena Love is an archaeologist whose fascination with archaeology was cultivated from a young age. In Egypt, she has worked with the Giza Plateau Mapping Project, Egypt Exploration Society's Survey of Memphis, helped document KV5 (the tomb of the sons of Rameses II) for the Theban Mapping Project, and more recently was involved with the Brown University Abydos Project. Serena is currently a honorary research fellow at the School of Social Science, University of Queensland and works as a Senior Archaeologist for Everick Heritage Consultants in Brisbane.
